This charming small wall hanging is foundation pieced in sections and then assembled with sashing. The pattern is suitable for a Christmas theme with a Yule Tree in the window and a suitably sized Santa or angel print in the doorway, or put whatever novelty motif you wish in the doorway. The trees flanking the cabin can be symmetrical or wonky; both variations are included in the pattern. The quilt measures about 12" square (depending on borders) and is a small fun project for fussy cut fabrics and scraps; the pattern is easy to adapt to fit novelty prints. As a bonus, these cabin quilts are fun to embellish with the decorative stitches on your sewing machine. A familiarity with basic foundation piecing techniques is helpful but not necessary for this project.

## Tools/Materials

- **Fabric:** You will need the following fabrics: All the other components of the design will need no more than a fat eighth of each fabric. Even scraps will suffice for the trees and the cabin components. Study the sample photo to get ideas for your fabric choices. The paper-pieced elements you need fabric for are:
  - 1. A fat quarter of background fabric.
  - 2. A fat quarter for the sashing.
  - 3. A fat quarter for the border (a 2"-3" wide 'border' print is a good choice).
  - 4. Trees and tree trunks\*.
  - 5. The Christmas tree in the window and/or the window itself\*.
  - 6. The doorway- this can be a closed door or have a figure in the doorway. If you choose to do a Christmas theme, a novelty print with a Santa or an angel about 1 ½ "w x 3"h is particularly effective for the doorway, or find an animal print for your doorway\*.
  - 7. The cabin walls and roof\*.
  - 8. A novelty print that will fit a triangle with a 5" base for the 'gingerbread' Gable End facade (above the door and window)\*.
  - 9. A variety of scraps for the paper pieced star on the top border. If desired, a motif that will cut effectively into a 3" square can be substituted for the foundation pieced star centered on the top border\*.

\*NOTE: Fat eighths or scraps will be sufficient for these pieces

- Freezer Paper: Optional, but helpful if you want to fussy-cut your fabric
- **Thread:** 100% cotton sewing thread in a neutral color, and decorative threads if you plan to embellish with machine embroidery.
- Sewing machine with standard accessories
- Scissors: small scissors for trimming seam allowances.
- A medium sized cutting mat, rotary cutter and cutting ruler: Choose whatever sizes you are most comfortable working with.
- 6" Add a Quarter<sup>TM</sup> ruler: Optional but very helpful for trimming seam allowances, a small regular ruler will work as well.
- **6" postcard or piece of stiff card stock:** Optional but helpful to fold foundation paper back to facilitate trimming seam allowances.
- Seam ripper
- Optional Embellishments: Beads, buttons, Christmas novelties...
- Pattern: The handout includes a master pattern for future use and a set of printed foundation papers for the project in class.
