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Have you been naughty or nice? What would make you very nice would be to make your loved ones some lovely Holiday Stockings (to hang up by the chimney with care). These quilted and lined stockings are pretty easy to make, so you could make a bunch of them while you're at it, and while you are at it, make one for yourself. They are large and sturdy enough to hold lots of stuffers and heavy oranges. You can add a faux-fur cuff or go for some holiday bling, then top them with elegant upholstery trim.

Tools/Materials

- **Patchwork Blocks:** The basic patchwork block for this stocking will be about 8" This can be a 6" – 7" block with a frame, or an 8" (finished) block. I will have several patchwork block designs to choose from (including some applique: a snowflake, a Menorah, or a Star of David). OR, if you have some orphan blocks, this would be a great way to use them.
- **Fabric:** You will need fabrics the following fabrics:
 1. Blocks – an assortment of 5 – 7 fabrics. 12" squares would be suitable or a Layer Cake.
 2. Stocking body – a Fat Quarter.
 3. Lining – a Fat Quarter (I like using a silky lining that isn't sold by FQs. So 1/3 yard of something silky would be appropriate.
 4. Cuff – 5" x 18" piece of Faux Fur, or 18" of a wide decorative Upholstery trim at least 3" – 4" wide.
- **A Fat Quarter of thin even batting:** Something like Warm & Natural or Warm & White.
- **Fusible web (optional):** This will be needed only if you make an applique block; choose your favorite brand. ¼ yard should do.
- **Cutting mat, rotary cutter and cutting ruler:** A 6" x 24" ruler is helpful for cutting both the templates and the fabric.
- **Scissors:** Good ones for cutting fabric, as for cutting freezer paper templates.
- **Freezer paper:** About 1 yard from a roll should be adequate.
- **Sewing pins**
- **Thread:** Bring thread for construction of the stocking plus coordinating colors for quilting.
- **Thread snips**
- **Sewing machine with standard accessories* (see note):** standard ¼" piecing foot. Zig zag (or wide embroidery) foot, and a free-motion or walking foot.
- **Embellishments (optional):** Jingle Bells, ribbon, floral picks, wired pine cones...

Note: If you have an embroidery machine, you can use the decorative alphabet stitches to add the name of the recipient. Alternatively, you can stitch a name onto the stocking with embroidery floss, or cut and fuse letters onto the stocking

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
